

Charlotte Johnson: My Dad And Other Lies asance Dome (Venue 23), until 29 August 000

"Nobody wants to watch a play about my Dad saving the NHS!" gushes Charlotte, selfdescribed macramé expert, pop star, jewellery maker, podcaster, everything-shewants-to-be doer but primar-ily "Daddy's Girl" daughter of Boris Johnson (injunction alert!). Or this character, played with a brilliantly bratty attitude, could also be the comic creation of Charlotte Johnson née Evans.

A delicious multi-platform parody of privilege, it's an upbeat hour of audience participation in which Char lotte laments her lot and encourages us to be "kinder" and "more respectful" to "nepo(tism) babies" - children of celebrities - many of whom "built the Fringe" and whose offspring are performing sold-out shows this year.

So, how's that fair, yah?
"We're here, don't judge us," she says in a show that lets the audience "shine" by forcing them to do the majority of the work, while sending spiky rebuffs to anyone who isn't entirely responsible, in true free market style, for their own success. The dynamic might be depressingly familiar, but the delivery by our "actually just very talented" host is pure, predictable fun. We're her sycophantic interviewers, flailing backing dancers, and uncredited stage hands, desperately try-ing to do the Daddy's Girls musical opening number that, try as we might, we just can't get right.

SALLY STOTT THEATRE

Manbo

Gilded Balloon Teviot (Venue 14), until 29 August 0000

"Grab my balls!" shouts Manbo, handing out coloured (plastic) balls as we are blasted, with the force of a hand-held wind machine, into his high-octane world of comic action adven-

With an ever-revolving wheel of movie references, from Rambo to Apocalypse Now Bocky to James Bond. it's a physically challenging, extremely silly, hour of pure, embodied entertainment. "There will be audience participation," says Sam Dugmore, as Manbo, at the start-the kind where we're required to regularly get shot at, blown up and, at one point, create the carnage of a children's ball pool. The story is gloriously far-

fetched, set against the backdrop of Afghanistan and the military career of Manbo, who wants to quit, but just can't resist the opportunity to carry out a Bonnie Tylerinspired training montage. He's the kind of character who could have essentially the same show on every year at the Fringe and it would still be a total treat to keep going back to them. An all-American romantic paired with every character played by Sylvester Stallone beginning with the letter "R", Dugmore uses mime with the power of a land mine, but also expertly balances shifts in tone and pace to create the excitement but also emotion of the great action films that he parodies, to celebrate "the best goddamn comic soldier in human history"

Straight out of college, Hope (the name is portentous) moves to London from Mac clesfield, head full of the bright lights. Anne Rabbitt last appeared on the Fringe in 1986 with her double-act partner Doon Mackichan. In the 1980s, Rabbitt & Doon appeared alongside Jo Brand, Jenny Eclair, Paul Merton and others. While Mackichan went on to success in radio, TV and film, Rabbitt's career was dogged by bad luck: an agent declared bankrupt, a theatre which burned down just before her West End debut opposite Griff Rhys Jones. Having not been on stage for 15 years, Rabbitt is now back with a clever, quirky onewoman show in which she demonstrates she has lost none of the talent and courage which should, by rights, have taken her further up the showbiz ladder.

At the age of "not quite 60", she books herself in for a service. The 1962 Classic Rabbitt model has been reliable and family-friendly, despite the occasional breakdown. Now, there's a tendon issue and the cooling system is shot. With reference to the user's manual, a mechanic/shrink (also played by Rabbitt) diagnoses problems and proposes solutions.

Self Service is a hard show to categorise, a mixture of autobiography, comedy and self-help. Rabbitt is disarmingly honest about the demands of being creative while raising kids, her frustration with her role-play job in corporate development and the feeling she has lost touch with who she is. She plays multiple parts, sings in a variety of styles and plays the accordion.

Priyanka has been selected as part of a cohort of burgeoning dramatists handpicked to join the prestigious Kennedy Center's mentorship program for extraordinary playwrights this summer, where she will be completing the third play in her triptych of solos titled THE WALL. Not too long ago, The first solo play in this series, THE ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM, had its critically acclaimed DC-premiere at The Kennedy Center in November 2019.

The Kennedy Center Playwriting Intensive is led by Gary Garrison, an award-winning playwright, screenwriter, and educator who has served as Executive Director of Creative Affairs for the Dramatists Guild of America and the Dramatists Guild Institute of Field Learning and Dramatic Writing in New York. This year Jacqueline Lawton and TJ Young have been added to the leadership roster. The 2021 intensive is designed to reach out and offer mentorship to playwrights throughout the country who may be from different backgrounds but according to Gary "what's common to all of them is, in a word, talent."

A One-Woman Show by Priyanka Shetty

#CHARLOTTESVILLE is a solo play about the white supremacist "Unite the Right" rally and the events that took place on August 11th & 12th, 2017, in Charlottesville, Virginia. It is constructed verbatim from interviews with close to a hundred local residents impacted by the events and its aftermath. The play highlights the real-life experiences of the interviewees as they dealt with the crisis and continue to find ways to move forward as individuals and as a community. The play also explores deep-seated racial inequities that have existed historically in Charlottesville and how it escalated to one of the most terrible manifestations of racial violence in America.



The play will be directed by Yury Urnov, Artistic Director at the Tony award-winning Wilma Theatre and the recipient of the 2024 Helen Hayes Award for Outstanding Direction of A Play for Wooly Mammoth's My Mama and the Full-Scale Invasion. The play was listed in the Smithsonian Associates as one of Theatre Washington's' Critic's Picks in the 24/25 DC Theatre Season. This is Priyanka's second consecutive inclusion in Keegan Theatre's season after last year's successful run of The Elephant in the Room. Priyanka is currently Keegan's Playwright-in-Residence and has also received a commission from Keegan Theatre for the development of THE WALL, the third and final play in her Triptych of Solos.

Priyanka's solo play #CHARLOTTESVILLE, was featured along with legendary solo performer Roger Guenvere Smith's Otto Frank at a special Performance Symposium at DePaul University. To deepen audience understanding of both plays, this 3-day symposium also included a talk with Professor Pamela S. Nadell to explore the deep roots of the racist ideology that led to the explosion of antisemitism at the heart of both stories. #Charlottesville received a standing ovation and the post-show discussion was moderated by The Theatre School's David Chack, a professor of Jewish and Holocaust theatre and Identity Theatre at The Theatre School at DePaul University.

The event also included class visits where Roger Guenvere Smith expressed his admiration for Priyanka's talent and referred to her as a peer in their shared mission of creating socially relevant art. He also recognized her as an artist of this generation carrying forward the legacy of Anna Deavere Smith. Professor David Chack wrote "#CHARLOTTESVILLE is more than theatre or performance. In Judaism we say that the world stands on Deep Learning (Torah), on Service that is akin to active prayer (Avodah) and on acts of Lovingkindness (G'milut Chesed). Your piece was all three." Adding that the piece helped in understanding how racisms manifest, and the narratives can be challenged in the world we live in.



Priyanka's solo play #CHARLOTTESVILLE, was chosen as one of nine new works for the coveted 59E59 Theaters' "East to Edinburgh Goes Virtual" Festival in July 2021. This is the second of three plays in her Triptych of solos that reveals the harrowing and heartwrenching experiences of the residents of Charlottesville, Virginia who were present as counter-protestors at the white-supremacist "Unite the Right" rally on August 11th and 12th, 2017. Many survived and were seriously injured in the violent car attack that led to the tragic death of 32-year-old Heather Heyer.

Speaking about why this piece was chosen from a significant pool of submissions, Associate Curator at 59E59 Theaters' Jessica Hart says, "Priyanka's profound text is moving and thought-provoking. Her powerhouse performance made this an easy choice. This solo show held me captivated from the first sincuested moment to its poignant, final breath."



#CHARLOTTESVILLE is a solo play about the white supremacist "Unite the Right" rally and the events that took place between August 11-12, 2017, in Charlottesville, Virginia. It is constructed verbatim from interviews with local residents impacted by the events and its aftermath and highlights their real-life experiences as they dealt with the crisis and continue to find ways to move forward as individuals and as a community. The play explores deep-seated racial inequities that have existed historically in Charlottesville and how it escalated to one of the most terrible manifestations of racial violence during the 'Summer of Hate.'

NEA GRANT AWARDED TO THE WALL

Priyanka received a generous grant from National Endowment of the Arts for the development of THE WALL, the third and final play in her Triptych of Solos.



Priyanka's third play in her Triptych of Solos *THE WALL* was awarded a generous grant by the National Endowment of the Arts. This grant would enable her to develop her latest play with Theatre Horizon in Norristown, PA by engaging with immigrant communities in Norristown. Priyanka's solo performance project The Wall will explore the international immigrant experience in the wake of significant world events that carry social, political, and humanitarian implications. The development process will include interviews with Norristown's immigrant community, virtual interviews with immigrants in India and the United Kingdom, and public readings and performances of the work in progress. Theatre Horizon has also supported Priyanka's work by featuring her solo show The Elephant in the Room in their 2023/24 season.

THE WALL will have public readings of excerpts from the play in Norristown, PA at Theatre Horizon in May 2025. For more information visit theatrehorizon.org.



WORLD PREMIERE OF TRIPTYCH

Nationwide Launch in 2025/26

Priyanka's triptych of plays will be available for production as a coordinated nationwide premiere across multiple cities in 2025/26.

Priyanka brings a unique and global perspective as a South Asian immigrant and unpacks the quintessential American conflict of socio-economic inequality and racial violence in this triptych of solos. She says "I realized my own cultural background and identity gave me a unique lens through which I could unpack these issues and bring awareness to them. Each of these plays has a very important message and there's an urgency associated with sharing it, given our current political climate."





Each play in the triptych of solos tackles the issues of racial discrimination and violence from different perspectives:

THE ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM approaches it from the viewpoint of a South Asian woman and her transition from deeply embedded roots in India to finding context and common ground in America; the second play #CHARLOTTESVILLE explores it from the perspective of a city that was at the center of one of the most terrible manifestations of racial violence in America; lastly, THE WALL ties it up by highlighting the immigrant experience in America.

Priyanka made her Off-Broadway debut with a sold-out run at the Drama Desk award-winning 59E59 Theaters' "East to Edinburgh" Festival in 2022. She was also handpicked for the prestigious Kennedy Center Playwriting Intensive in 2021, and was the semi-finalist for the 2022 Eugene O'Neill National Playwrights Conference.
